The Values of ACCOUNTABILITY, COMPASSION, RESPECT and HONESTY are represented by the acronym and representative image of an ARCH. Each club should take the time to define each value for themselves and then commit to upholding the ARCH to the best of their ability throughout the 4-H year.

ACCOUNTABILITY

- Following through with commitments and assigned duties or responsibilities.
- Coming to club events on time and prepared to participate.

RESPECT

- For self, for others, or the group.
- For property and equipment and for adult leaders and legitimate authority.

COMPASSION

- Thinking of the needs of others, not just your own.
- Understanding the views, experiences, and uniqueness of others.
- Helping others to feel good about themselves.
- Being patient and tolerant of your own and others' mistakes.

HONESTY

- Willing to share and discuss your thoughts and feelings.
- Ability to reflect and assess your own strengths and weaknesses.
- Knowing what you are capable of doing and living up to your capabilities.
