ARTISTIC STATEMENT prepared by Joni Chapman and Jen Weiler

Let's start with a little background information about the art farts. Jen and Joni are both former art teachers from Ashland (and elsewhere). We met in the 1990s at UW - Madison, while we were pursuing our art teaching credentials.

When we looked at all of your artwork, we were awed at the array. We were impressed with the variety of subject matter, whether realistic, symbolic, or abstract and the different approaches people employed to create their artwork.

Our criteria for rating each piece involved a simple chart that included creativity, craftsmanship, and overall success in completing the artwork. We were very pleased that everyone met or exceeded our expectations. Each piece was assessed on its own merit, without comparison to other entries within the age bracket.

We would like to mention a few entries that were particularly memorable. One artist chose to treat the background with fire. Another artist sparked a discussion about ROY G BIV, which is the order of colors in the rainbow. One piece was so whimsical that we imagined the seeds of a pear to be eyes staring at us. Some pieces were examples of bas relief, otherwise known as 3-dimensional, as is evident in the soccer ball piece.

String art is fussy business. We really appreciate all of your hard work and creative ideas. Thank you for participating in this project. Also, don't forget that the 4H fair is coming up later this summer. Doug can fill you in about the dates and details.

So keep making stuff. We look forward to seeing your next projects.









