





As of June 2017, the "Bay Area Paint Exchange" is no longer in operation. Latex paints (not accepted at Hazardous Waste Collections) can be dried and then disposed of in the trash. The lid should be removed and the can placed in a safe location for the contents to dry out. Once hardened, it can be placed in the trash. Oil based paints, stains, and paints containing lead are accepted at the annual Clean Sweep Hazardous Waste Collections. See the next page to find a Clean Sweep near you!

Household Hazardous Waste or Not?

Many products you use in your home and yard contain hazardous materials. Improper disposal of these products can cause fires, injuries to people and animals, and groundwater contamination. This guide will help you identify hazardous products in your home. Keep your home safe by disposing of hazardous products properly.

A hazardous product has at least one of the following properties:

Toxic


Poisonous or causes long-term illness (such as cancer). Pesticides, paint thinners, many auto products and some cleaners are toxic. Look for words on the product label like:

- "Harmful or fatal if swallowed"

- "Use only in a well-ventilated area" (this means product fumes are toxic)

flammable

Burns easily. Paint, thinners and other solvents, and auto products are the most flammable home products. Look for words on the product label like:

Corrosive

Eats through materials (acid, for example). Oven cleaners, drain cleaners, toilet bowl cleaners and auto batteries are common corrosive products. Look for words on the product label like:

- "Causes severe burns on contact"
- "Can burn eyes, skin, and throat"

Reactive

Can spontaneously ignite or create poisonous vapors when mixed with other products (NEVER mix household products), or can explode when exposed to heat, air, water or shock. Fortunately, there are few consumer products still on the market that are explosive (except for fireworks). Some older explosive products might still be stored in homes. NW Cleansweep does not accept explosives of any kindcontact your local Sheriff's Office.



- "Do not use near heat or flame"
- "Combustible"
- "Do not smoke while using this product"



- > Read product label. Follow use directions carefully.
- Watch out for signal words, such as CAUTION, WARNING, OR DANGER. Keep all of these products away from children!
- Buy just enough product to do the job. Share unused products.
- Return used motor oil to a waste oil collection site for recycling. Keep leftover products in original containers.



- Do not DUMP leftover products in the backyard, woods or down the storm sewer.
- > Do not BURN leftover products.
- Do not BURY leftover products.
- Do not REUSE pesticide or other chemical containers for other purposes.
- Do not MIX chemical wastes.

CLEANSWEEP WILL ACCEPT

Household hazardous waste will be accepted at the above locations and only at designated times. Items will be taken for free from residential properties, with the exception of fees charged for bulbs and batteries. Acceptable items include materials such as, oilbased paints, aerosol spray paints and lubricants, solvents, pesticides, fertilizers, household and hazardous cleaners, corrosives, flammables, mercury, lead tackle and shot, old gas, antifreeze, and other chemicals you wouldn't consider dumping. Mercury containing thermostats, switches, and thermometers, and lead based paint will also be accepted.

CLEANSWEEP WILL NOT ACCEPT

- Latex Paint
- Empty Paint Cans
- Oil Filters
- Motor Oil
- Explosives, Flares or Fireworks

WHO CAN ATTEND

Residents from each participating county can utilize any of the cleansweep collection events. Proof of residence may be required.

Businesses qualified as Very Small Quantity Generators (VSQG) and Agricultural Producers (farmers/farms) wanting to dispose of chemicals should contact Zach Davis, Veolia Environmental Services at <u>zach.davis@veolia.com</u>. Preregistration is required at least two weeks in advance of the event, including a full list of materials and prepayment/authorization. Farmers/Farms may dispose of up to 200 pounds of pesticides for free at the collection events, with preregistration required.
