#1	4-H Online Enrollment & Registration new & renewal	Youth, families, & Leaders who live in Ashland County and want to:  Continue membership in local 4-H, or Begin membership in local 4-H	4-H Online is the online enrollment and registration system for county 4-H Clubs in Wisconsin. Enter basic information to record your participation, manage your 4-H club or individual projects, train as a volunteer, ID 4-H animals, register faster for events, and more. This is the data system required for sending communications from local and state programs, so please sign-up to stay connected!	4-H Online Log-In here Online Registration support here
#2	Member Record Book (RB)	Local 4-H youth between the ages of 9 and 19 Youth ages 5-8 can submit practice record books to office if desired	The 4-H Record Book is a summary of what you have done for the 4-H year. This reflection helps with goal setting and offers youth a chance to learn about themselves and their environments. Submit records to primary Club Leaders. #3	Member Evaluation (ME) Process apply for funds	Local 4-H youth who have submitted at least 1 Record Book - this could be a past Record Book or one for this recent year	The Member Evaluation process records a youth's entire 4-H journey to date, including any special roles, activities, trips, and skills from their experiences. The completed ME can be submitted to apply for funding a 4-H activity the youth is pursuing. Recipients announced at the Gala in Nov.	<u>ME Forms</u> <u>available</u> <u>here</u>
#4	Leaders Association 4-H Senior Scholarship	Youth members with at least 3 years in 4-H and who currently attend high school as a senior student in Ashland County	The Ashland County Leaders Association annually awards up to 4 individual scholarships to local 4-H seniors that have applied, been reviewed, and honored with this funding. Candidates must have any continued education planned after graduation. Recipients are announced at the November Gala.	<u>Senior</u> <u>Scholarship</u> <u>Application</u> <u>here</u>
#5	Club Record Book Check	Current 4-H Adult Leaders who have an established local 4-H Club	As Club members finish their member records, they first submit them to their Club Leader for review. This helps collect information for the overall Club's Record Book Check as the annual account of the Club's progress and activity.	Record Book Check here *also sent in mail
#6	Club Charter new & renewal	<ul> <li>4-H Adult Leaders who:</li> <li>Already have established local 4-H Clubs, or</li> <li>Want to begin new local 4-H Clubs</li> </ul>	The 4-H Charter ensures a Club exists in agreement with the Wisconsin 4-H program. This formal authorization allows a Club certain rights, including the ability to use the 4-H Name and Emblem for educational purposes in accordance with laws and regulations established by Congress and the USDA.	<u>WI 4-H Charter</u> <u>Page here</u>




## A DEEPER DIVE INTO FALL



#### Why 4-H values record-keeping and encourages youth to use it...

4-H invests in the positive growth of youth with clubs, projects, and resources to support holistic learning. 4-H provides key qualities and tools to help youth realize the lessons from their experiences (<u>see life skills here</u>). As the 4-H year re-starts in Fall, it is a natural time to focus on the reflection step within experiential learning (<u>image on right - see full model here</u>). Youth ages 9 to 19 are encouraged to track their 4-H journey and recognize the knowledge, skills, and interests gained. This step has many benefits, like inspiring youth to explore new talents, reminding them of their esteemable acts, and empowering them as unique individuals. Recalling personal victories helps improve critical thinking and positive self-esteem during earlier life stages, and these records are a useful portfolio to review when writing speeches, applications, resumes, and more, later on in life.



Record-keeping is a chance for youth to represent themselves as they wish. Wisconsin and other state 4-H programs have ample guides regarding different ways of record-keeping so youth may find an option they enjoy (see guide lists below). Some specific awards or projects may require particular record forms, but most often 4-H record-keeping allows an array of styles whether they are done with notebooks, spreadsheets, photographs, slideshows, journals, videos, or a method they design. As long as the youth is the main author of the record, and includes experiences, lessons, and goals, they are welcome to get creative and use whatever they prefer to format their ideas.

#### Some Goals of 4-H Record-Keeping

- Understand value & work of organizing events
- · Practice time-management & goal-setting
- Identify important experiences and changes
- · Practice how to summarize activities and skills
- Practice how to evaluate and describe experiences
- Practice individual communication styles
- Practice accountability & responsibility with projects
- Use different tools & technology for presentations
- Gain insights into self skills & character traits

#### Info & Tools to Support Record-Keeping

- Records can be kept in beginner-level or more advanced ways depending on individual preferences.
- Tools like this 4-H Story tutorial or Yearly Member Summary doc can help summarize overall learning.
- The <u>Yearly Self-Evaluation tool</u> can be done individually or in discussion with a mentor.
- This <u>Tipsheet</u> helps with goal-setting and planning on next steps in a project area.


